Perennial Weeds

Target: deplete nutrient reserves in root system, prevent seed production

- Allow plants to expend as much energy from root system as possible; do not treat when first emerging in spring but allow to grow to bud/bloom stage.
- Herbicide treatment at bud to bloom stage or in the fall. In the fall plants draw nutrients into the roots for winter storage. Herbicides will be drawn down to the roots more efficiently at this time. If the weed patch has been there a long time, another season of seed production is not as important as getting the herbicide into the root system. Spraying in the fall will kill the following year's shoots, which are being

Weeds of Concern

The Jordan Valley CWMA encompasses over 4.5 million acres of private state and BLM lands in Malheur County Oregon, and Owyhee County, Idaho. The major weed problems addressed are leafy spurge, White top, perennial pepperweed and scotch thistle. Other noxious weed of concern for the CWMA are russian, diffuse and spotted knapweeds; Canada thistle, yellow starthistle, rush skeletonweed and a former ornamental, saltcedar.
