## Russian Knapweed

Russian Knapweed (*Acroptilon repens*) is a Creeping herbaceous perennial that reproduces from seed and vegetative root buds. Stems are erect, 18 to 36 inches tall, with multiple branches. Lower leaves are 2 to 4 inches long and deeply lobed. Upper leaves are smaller, smoother margined but can be slightly lobed. Solitary flowers are urn-shaped, 1/4 to 1/2 in in diameter and occur on shoot tips.

- Emerge early spring, bolt May to June, flower summer into fall.
- Key to control: stress and cause to expend nutrient stores in root system.
- Best management plan includes cultural control with mechanical and/or chemical control.
- Use desirable plants to compete for space.
